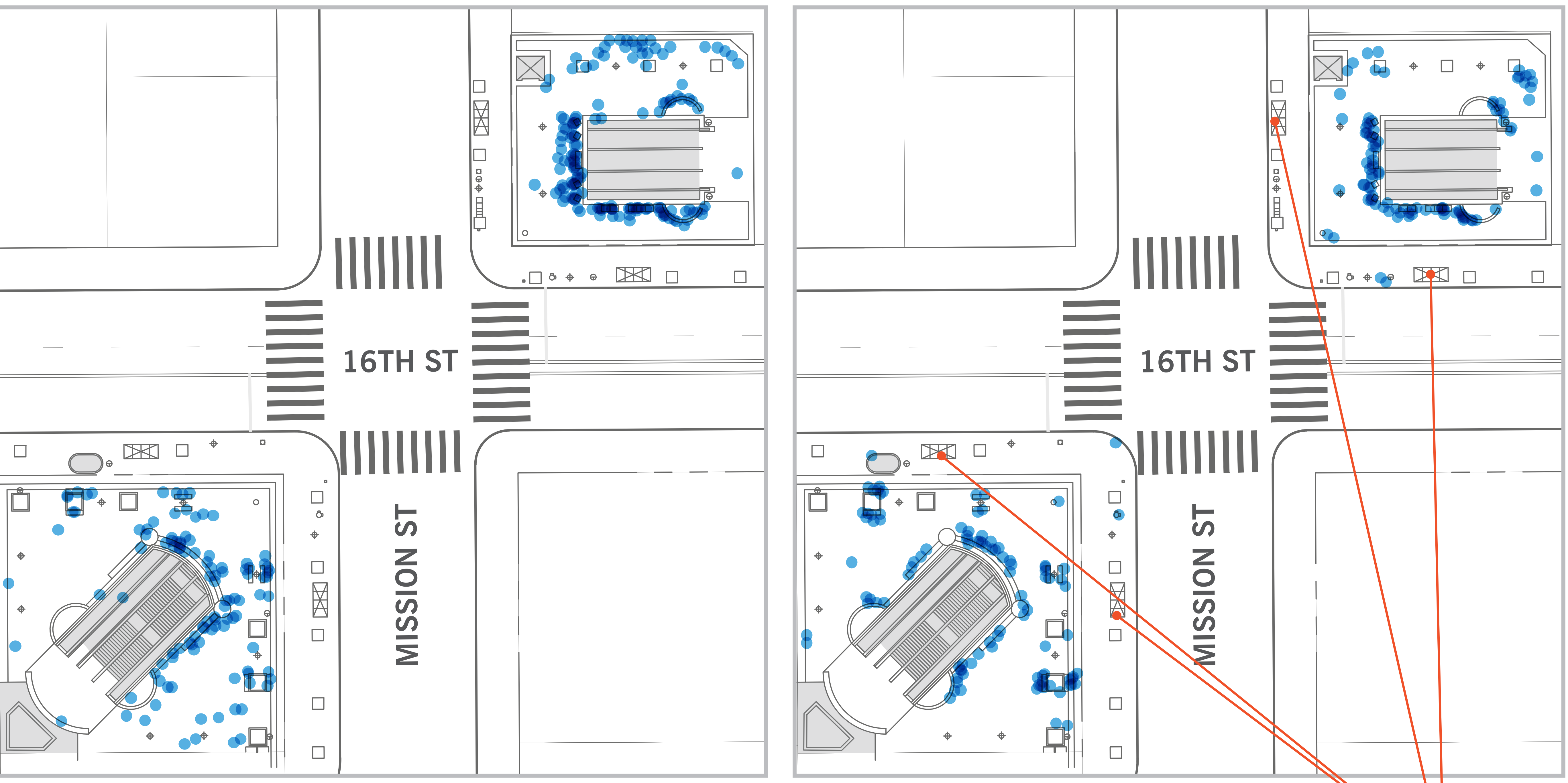


16TH ST BART PLAZA STATIONARY ACTIVITY

This series of maps illustrates some of the detailed information that our volunteers observed and documented on the 16th Street BART plazas. A “people watching” activity is defined when an individual is stationary but looking around, relaxing, or simply “watching his/her surroundings”, and he/she may or may not stay at that location for a long time. *People watching* indicates that such individual feels comfortable enough in that plaza to pause and look around- if such behavior had to extend for a long time it could seem as idling to other users. “Sitting informally” is defined when an individual is observed sitting on a location other than a bench or any other furniture specifically designed for sitting. These observations can help us analyze how different elements on these plazas are being informally used as seating, and point out to the high demand for seating furniture that is flexible and adaptable.

PEOPLE WATCHING (ONE COLORED CIRCLE REPRESENTS ONE PERSON)

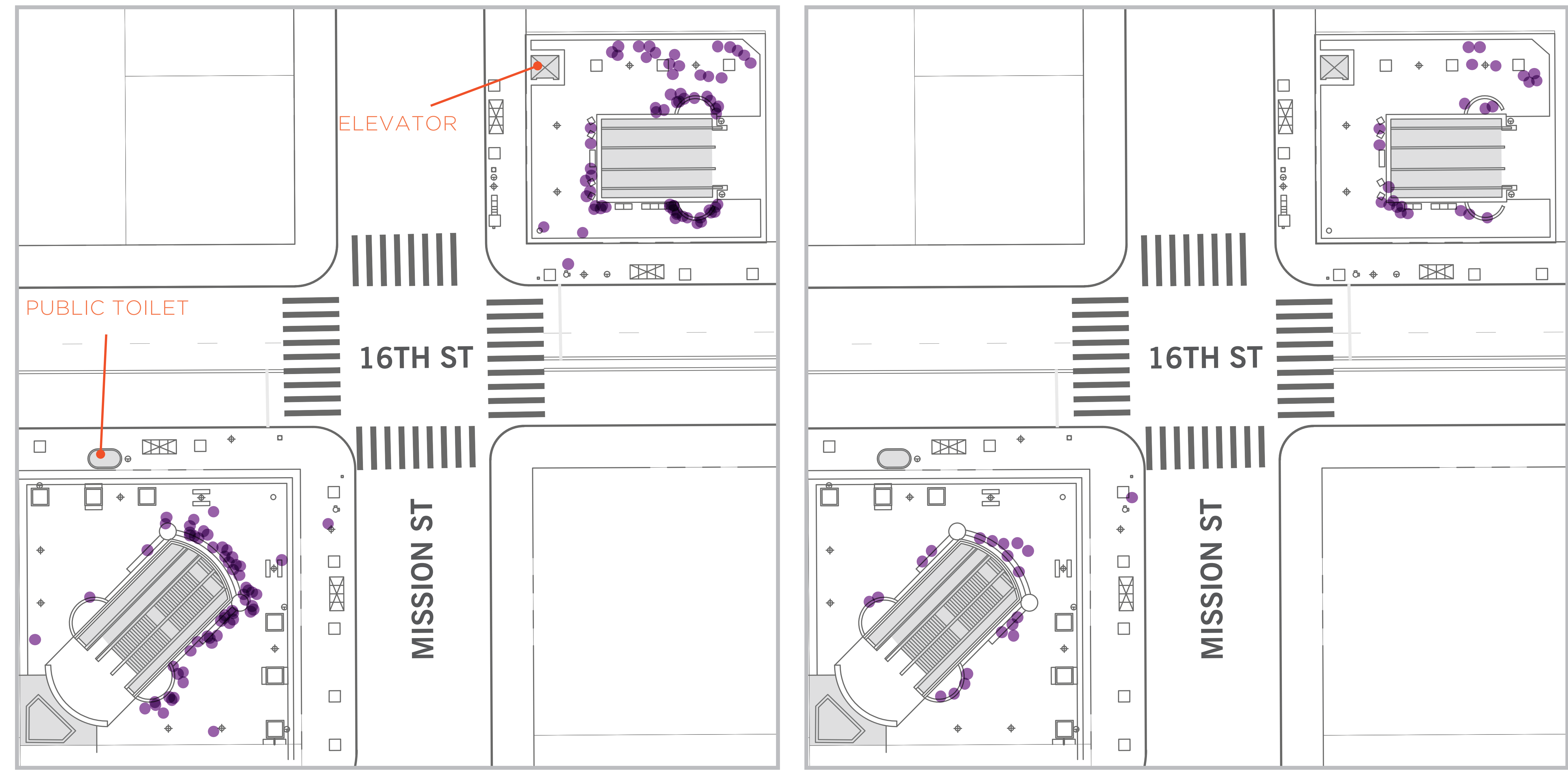
